Arnold, Tedd. Hooray for Fly Guy. Fly Guy joins Buzz's football team, despite Coach's misgivings, and hits the field for a special, secret play. Lexile: 270

George, Jean Craighead. Goose and Duck. A young boy becomes the "mother" to a goose, who becomes "mother" to a duck, as they learn about the rhythms of nature together. Lexile: 370

Hayes, Geoffrey. Benny and Penny in Just Pretend: a Toon Book. Annoyed with his little sister who always wants to play pretend with him, Benny tries to avoid her but soon feels bad after she is gone. Lexile: 90
